
Example Independent School District, Spring 2024 Student and Parent Survey Results

For the 2023-24 school year, Example Independent School District (Example ISD) set district goals in order to improve students' education. To measure progress towards these goals, Example ISD surveyed students and parents in Spring 2024. The figures below show the percentage of students and parents who agreed with each goal at Example Elementary School compared to districtwide. The teal ( ) shows information for students and parents at Example Elementary School, and the blue ( ) shows information for all of Example ISD. The summary radial figure uses the average agreement for the items in each goal (parents or students who agreed more often than not are counted as agreeing). The survey questions used to measure each goal are presented with the percentage of students and parents who answered positively for each question.

















The first three graphics below summarize the percentage of parents who agree or disagree with statements about Example ISD. Green icons ( $\mathring{\P}$ ) represent parents at Example Elementary School who strongly agree, light green icons ( $\mathring{\P}$ ) represent those who agree, light orange icons ( $\mathring{\P}$ ) represent those who disagree, and orange icons ( $\mathring{\P}$ ) represent those who strongly disagree. The fourth question asks parents their likelihood of recommending Example ISD to others on a scale of 10 (very likely) to 0 (not likely).




